- Thinking Vs Feeling: Thinking type rely on the rational cause-effect logic and scientific method to make decision. Feeling type weigh their options against their personal values more than on rational logic.
- Judging Vs Perceiving: Judging type enjoy the control of decision making and want to resolve quickly. Perceiving types are more flexible.
