# COMPATIBILITY OF PESTICIDES WITH OTHER AGRO CHEMICALS AND PHYTOTOXICITY OF INSECTICIDES

## **Objective:**

To get acquainted with the compatibility and phytotoxicity of pesticides

#### Compatibility of spray chemicals:

When t wo c hemicals a re br ought t ogether i n a s ingle s pray m ixture, due t o r eaction, a compound differing from e ither p arent m ay be formed. Knowledge of t he e ffects of s uch compounds on the plants when applied is essential to avoid improper use.

## The different types if incompatibility are:

- 1. Chemical incompatibility: Different compounds are formed due to reaction of various chemicals as in synthetic or ganic compounds with an alkaline material which causes injury to plants.
- 2. Phytotoxic incompatibility: The component parts though themselves are not injurious to the pl ants a nd do not s how a ny c hemical r eaction when m ixed, the m ixture c auses injury to plants.
- 3. Physical inc ompatibility: The chemicals change the ir physical form to one that is unstable and hazardous for application.

### Phytotoxicity of insecticides:

The adverse effect of i nsecticide on the plants due to the treatment is known as phytotoxicity. These effects on plant may either be permanent leading to death of the plant or temporary leaving scorching behind and allowing the plant to recover after some time. Many of the chemicals, which are non-phytotoxic at normal doses may prove to be phytotoxic at higher doses.

#### **Record Work:**

- 1. Observe the physical compatibility by mixing any two insecticides.
- 2. Spray a chemical with hand sprayer to demonstrate phytotoxicity
