## People Processing

### Customers must:

- Physically enter the service factory
- Co-operate actively with the service operation
- Managers should think about process and output from customer's perspective
- To identify benefits created and non-financial costs:
  - Time, mental, physical effort

# Possession Processing

- Customer ask to provide tangible treatment
- Repair/ maintenance
- Refueling
- Laundry
- Gardening

## Possession Processing

- Customers are less physically involved compared to people processing services
- Involvement is limited
- Production and consumption are separable

# Mental Stimulus Processing

- Directed at people's mind or anything that touches people mind and influence behavior
- Education
- News/information
- Music concert
- religion

## Mental Stimulus Processing

- Ethical standards required when customers who depend on such services can potentially be manipulated by suppliers
- Physical presence of recipients not required
- Core content of services is information-based
  - Can be “inventoried”

## Information Processing

- Information is the most intangible form of service output
- But may be transformed into enduring forms of service output
