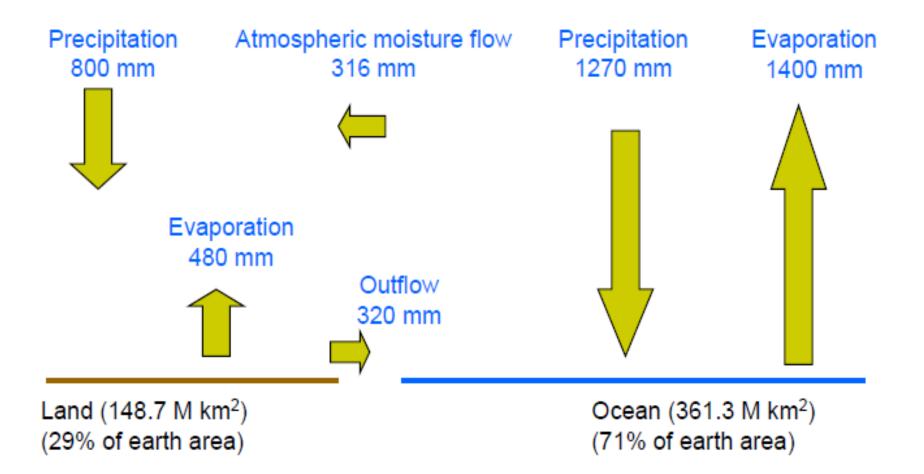

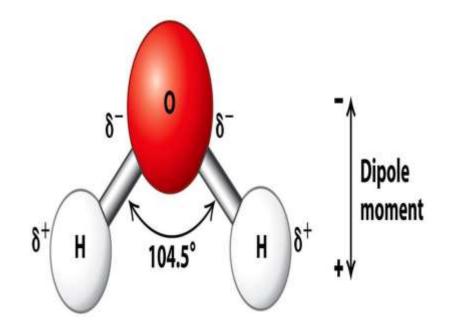
# What is hydrology?

Sum of two terms:

**Hydro + Logus** 

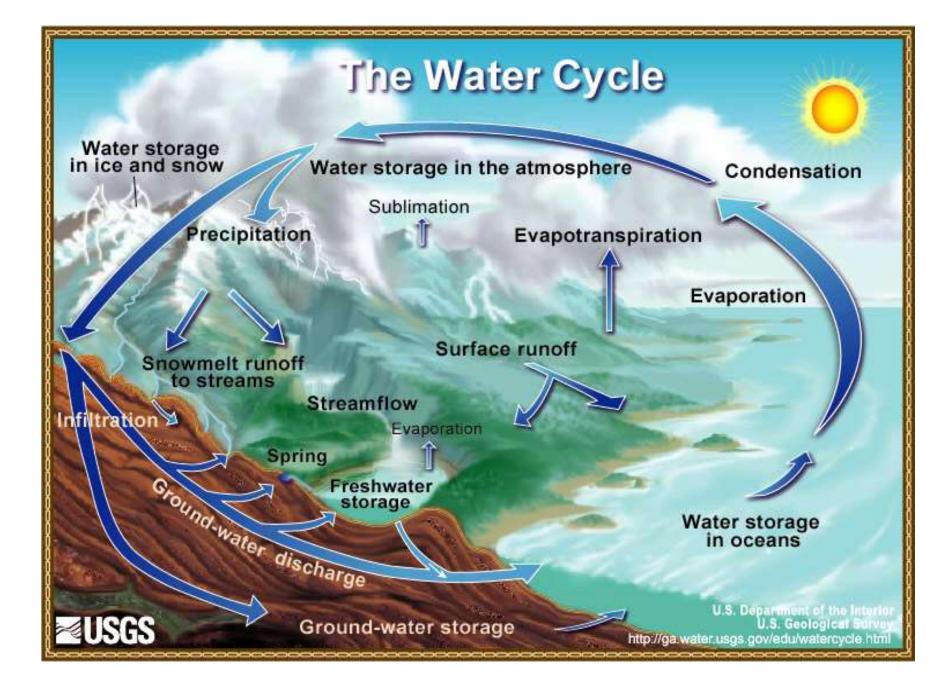
**Hydro** = Water

**Logus** = Study



C In a broad sense:

HYDROLOGY can be defined as the STUDY OF WATER – its occurrence, distribution, movement, and properties of all the waters of the earth and its atmosphere.



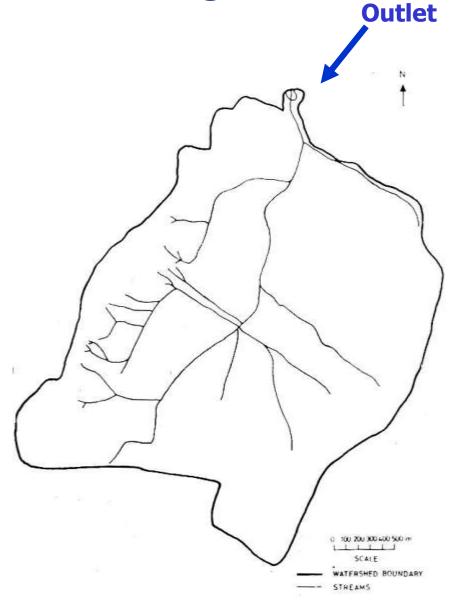
# HYDROLOGY | classification

Customarily, **Hydrology** is partitioned into

- Surface-Water Hydrology:
  Relation between water and the surface of the earth
- Groundwater Hydrology: Relation between water and lithosphere (subsurface portion of the earth)
- Potamology:
  It is the scientific studies of rivers.
- Limnology:
  It is the study of inland waters.

Watershed/Catchment/Drainage Basin:

It is defined as the land area which contributes surface runoff to a specific discharge point (i.e., outlet). It is outlined by surface water divides (also called 'topographic divides').





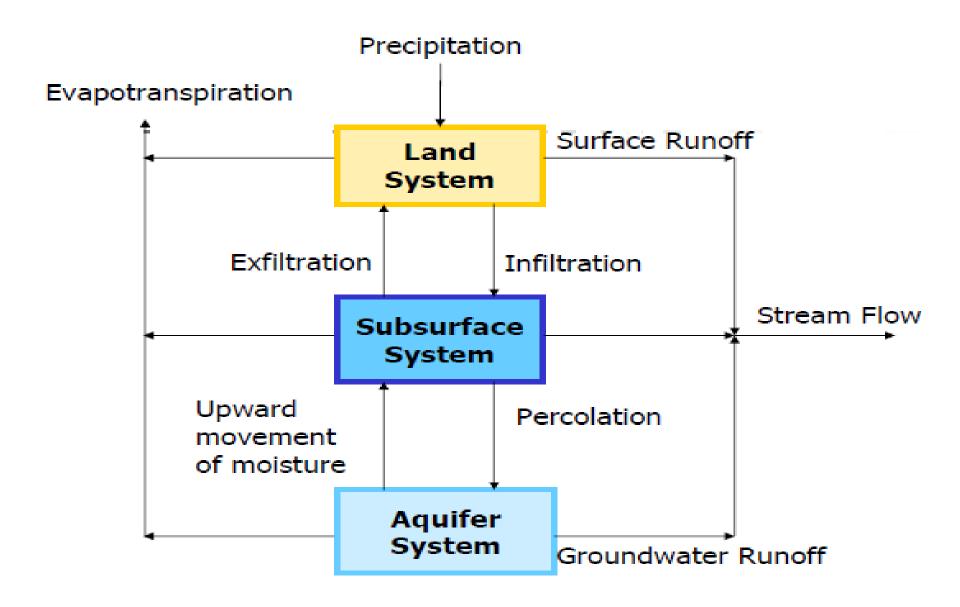
#### **Hydrologic Cycle**

From a global perspective, Hydrological cycle may be considered to be comprised of three major systems:

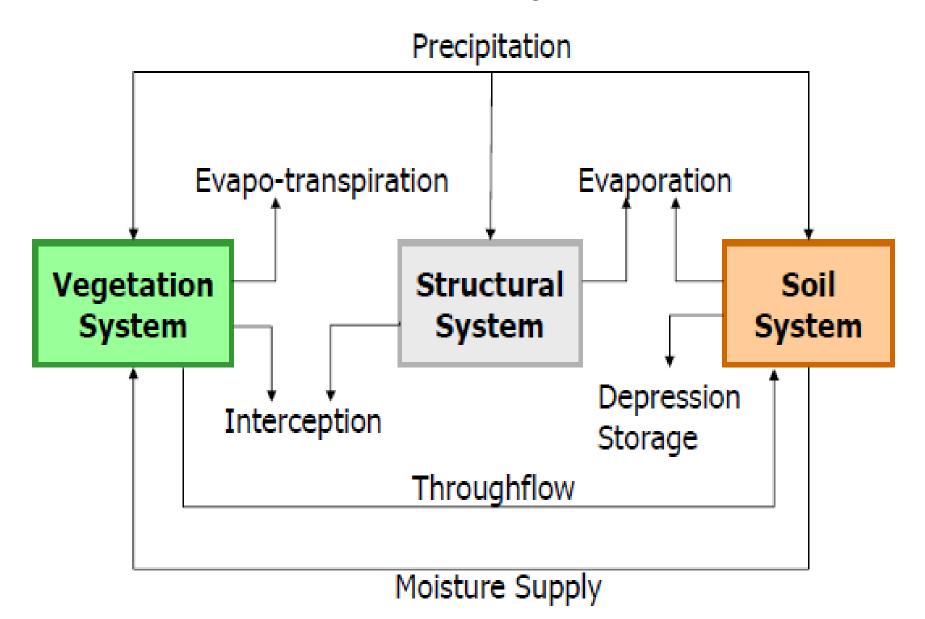
The Oceans – as the major source of water
The Atmosphere – as the deliverer of water
The Land – as the user of water

Principal processes that transmit water from one system to other are Precipitation, Runoff and Evaporation

#### The Earth System

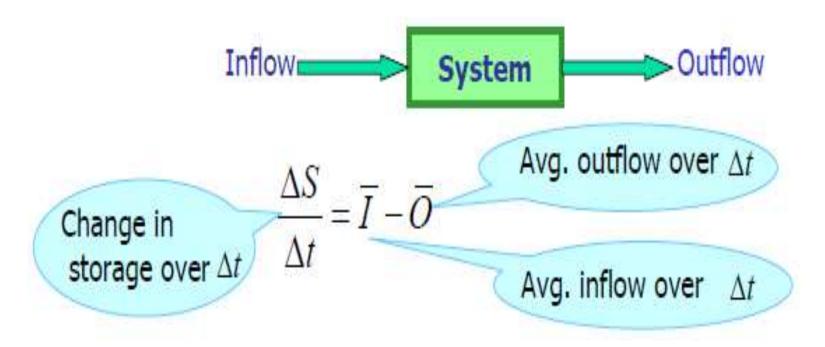


#### The Land System



#### Hydrological budget

Mathematical statement of Hydrological cycle



#### If I and O vary continuously with time

$$\frac{ds(t)}{dt} = I(t) - O(t)$$
 Any hydrological analyses must satisfy this Eq.

### **Water Balance Equation**

In volumetric terms, it can be expressed as

$$S(t) - S(0) = V_I(t) - V_O(t)$$

Including various components of hydrological cycle

$$S_{s}(t) - S_{s}(0) + S_{m}(t) - S_{m}(0) + S_{g}(t) - S_{g}(0) + S_{i}(t) - S_{i}(0) = P - V_{Q} - E - T - F$$
Surface Soil moisture Ground water Interception

E, T, F, Si = Hydrological abstraction  $V_{\mathcal{Q}}$  = Basin Yield

## Example 1.1

A lake had a water surface elevation of 103.200 m above datum at the beginning of a certain month. In that month, the lake received an average inflow of 6.0 m<sup>3</sup>/s from surface runoff sources. In the same period, the outflow from the lake had an average value of 6.5 m<sup>3</sup>/s. Further, in that month, the lake received a rainfall of 145 mm and the evaporation from the lake surface was estimated as 6.10 cm. Write the water-budget equation for the lake and calculate the water surface elevation of the lake at the end of the month. The average lake-surface area can be taken as 5000 ha. Assume that there is no contribution to or from the groundwater storage.
