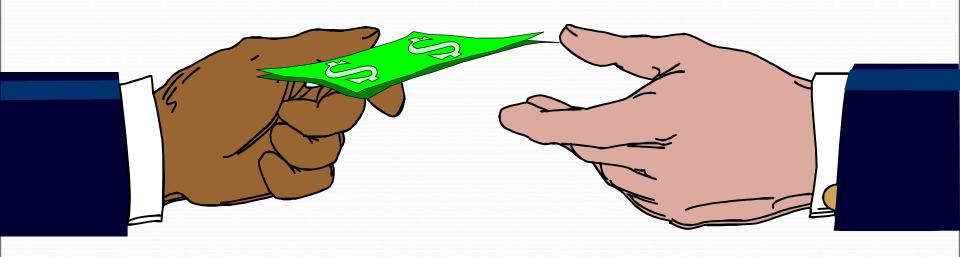

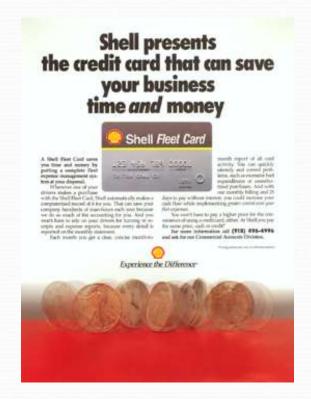

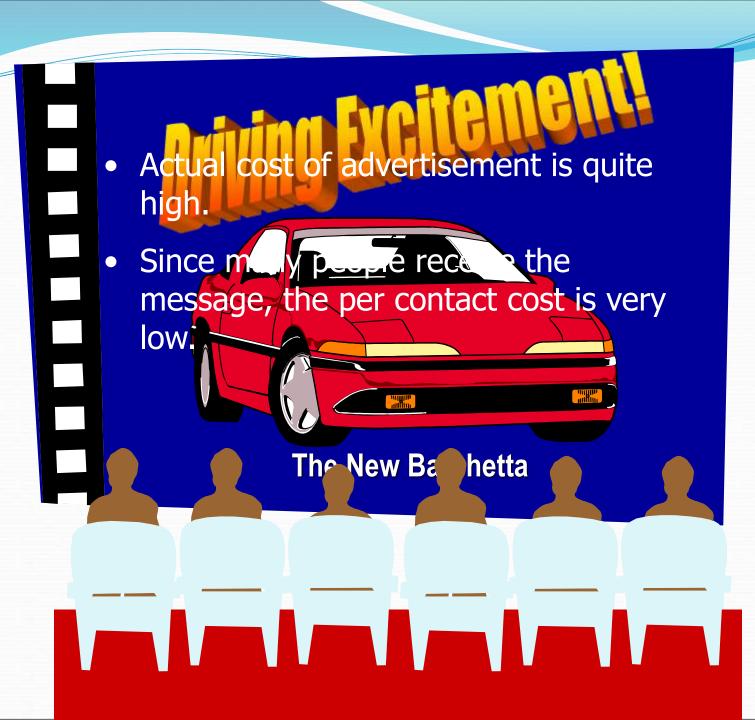
Advertising

Any paid form of non personal presentation of ideas, images, goods, or services



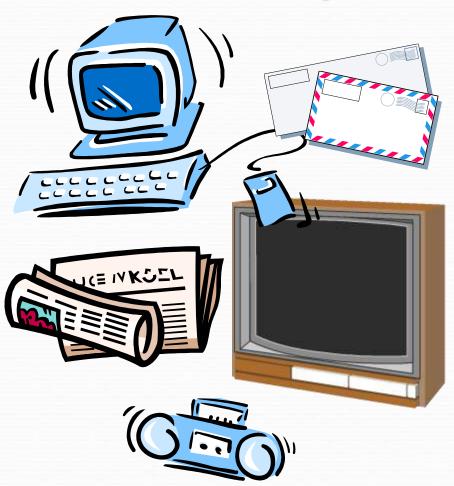


The most visible element of the promotional mix

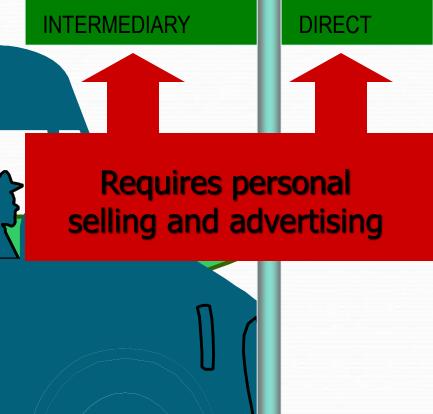
