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INTRODUCTION

- Service is a "deed, a performance, an effort" (Rathmell, 1966).
- ➤It is intangible.
- ➤It may or may not be attached with a physical product.

*The economic contribution of Service sector in India is given as follows:-

Services: 61.6% (25%)

Agriculture and allied: 15.4% (53%)

Manufacturing: 23% (22%)

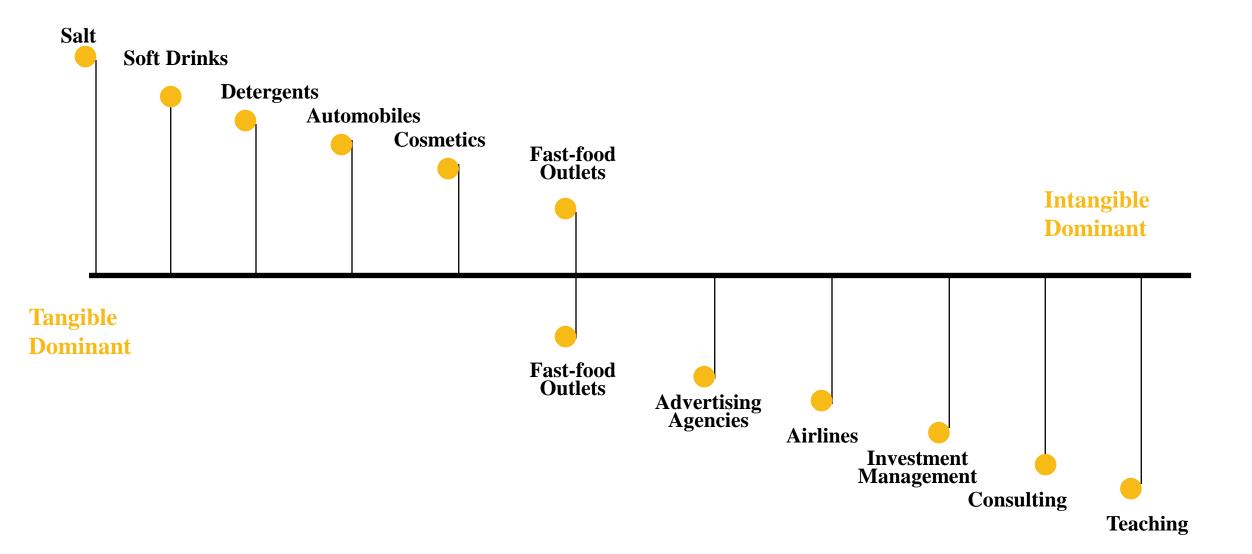

CHARACTERISTICS OF SERVICES

Intangibility

Intangibility means that services cannot be seen, tasted, felt, heard or smelled before they are bought. It means we cannot try them out.

Heterogeneity

It refers to the fact that the quality of services can vary greatly, depending on who provides them and when, where and how.

Inseparability

It means that services are produced and consumed at the same time. This also entails that services cannot be separated from their providers. Contrary to services, physical goods are produced, then stored, later sold, and even later consumed.

Perishability

Perishability means that services cannot be stored for later sale or use. In other words, services cannot be inventoried. This is one of the most significant characteristics of services, since it may have a major impact on financial results.

SERVICE CHARACTERISTICS-MARKETING DIFFICULTIES FACED

Intangibility

- > Services cannot be stored.
- Services cannot be protected through patents.

Heterogeneity

- ➤It is very difficult to standardize services and to have quality control!
- ➤ Eg. A machine can make ice cream cones a standard size 100% of the time.



Inseparability

- Service provider must be physically present to deliver service.
- Customer is involved in the production process.

Perishability

Demand fluctuates and changes, so it becomes difficult to match demand and supply.

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SERVICE CHARACTERISTICS-MARKETING STRATEGIES

Intangibility

>Stress on tangible cues, eg. "the power of the pyramid"- shape of Transamericas office building.

Focus on the service's benefits and satisfaction.

Heterogeneity

- ➤ Customise the service
- >Standardize the service



Inseparability

- The service organization must select and train their employees well.
- Consumer management ie. Home delivery

Perishability (Demand Strategies)

- Reservation systems
- Development of complementary services eg.Newspapers or TV in waiting rooms

Perishability (Supply Strategies)

- Capacity sharing
- Utilization of third parties for eg. Travel agents, OYO, Swiggy, Zomato etc
