

What is a Narrative?

A narrative or a **narrative essay** can be defined as **an account of an individual experience**. This explains a personal experience that had a significant impact on the individual's life. It can be of a journey, a special day such as the first day in school, one's marriage, an unforgettable day, etc. This highlights that through a narrative the individual can express and share something special with the reader. A narrative entails a sequence of events that are often related in chronological order. This will have various characters and a specific **plot** surrounding that story will be built.

What is a Descriptive Essay?

It does not have a story, but only a highly descriptive account. A descriptive essay does not mostly use the first person narration. It functions with the objective of presenting an image of something. In a descriptive essay, there is no plot or characters.
