Experiment No. 13

Weed Vegetation Analysis

13.1 Objectives

To learn about weed sampling

13.2 Procedure

Select a field where the various weed management practices have been used. The instructor will assign the sampling size to different groups. Use the quadrat samplings for the determination of the following quantitative estimates. In list or census quadrat method, individual weed species are listed and actual number of species per unit area is counted. It is easier to account the number of annual weed species. The rooted sprouts of individuals are considered as individual number in case of weed species propagated by vegetative means. Care should be taken to count the species which roots remain with the quadrats only.

13.3 Non-destructive method

1. **Weed density:**Count the number of individuals of a particular weed species per unit area and determine the relative density.

Total number of individuals of a species in all quadrants
Absolute density = ----
Total number of quadrants used

2. **Relative density:** Relative density is the study of numerical strength of a species in relation to the total number of individuals of all the species. It can be calculated in following way.

Absolute density of a species

Relativedensity = ----- x 100

Total absolute density of all species

3. **Frequency:** This is the degree of dispersion of individual species in an area and represents the number of sampling units in which the particular species occurred. It is expressed in terms of percent occurrence.

Quadrats occurence of a species
Absolutefrequency = ----- x 100
Total number of quadrants used

4. **Relative frequency:** The degree of dispersion of individual species in an area in relation to the number of all the species occurred. It can be determined from the absolute frequency by the following formula

Absolute frequency of a species

Relativefrequency = ------ x 100

Total of absolute frequency of all species

5. **Weed abundance**: It is the study of the number of individuals of different species in the community per unit area. By quadrats method, samplings are made at random at several places and the number of individuals of each species was summed up for all the quadrats divided by the total number of quadrats in which the species occurred. It is represented by the equation.

Total number of individuals of a species in all quadrates

Absolute abundance = ------ x 100

Total number of quadrates in which the species occurred

6. Relative abundance: It is the abundance of a species (by any measure) divided by the total abundance of all species combined.

Relative abundance = ------ x 100

Total number of individuals of all species in all quadrats

7. **Importance Value Index(IVI):** This index is used to determine the overall importance of each species in the community structure. In calculating this index, the percentage values of the relative frequency, relative density and relative abundance are summed up together andthis value is designated as the Importance Value Index or IVI of the species.

IVI=Relative density+ Relative Frequency + Relative Dominance
