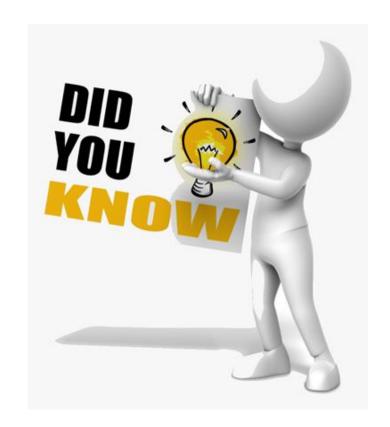

- A lathe is a machining tool that is used primarily for shaping metal or wood. It works by rotating the workpiece around a stationary cutting tool.
- The main use is to remove unwanted parts of the material, leaving behind a nicely shaped workpiece.



Introduction to Lathe Machine



- A lathe machine is a machine tool that removes the undesired material from a rotating workpiece in the form of chips with the help of a tool that is traversed across the work and can be feed deep into the work.
- It one of the most versatile and widely used machine tools all over the world.
- This is also known as the 'Mother of all Machines'.

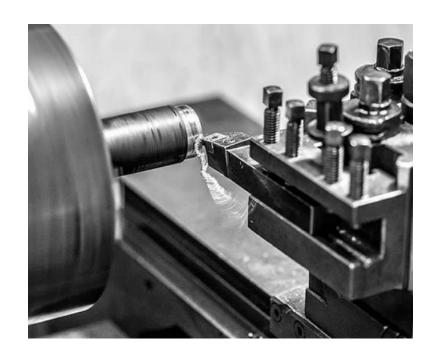


Introduction to Lathe Machine



Definition:

- Lathe machine is one of the most important machine tools which is used in the metalworking industry. It operates on the principle of a rotating work piece and a fixed cutting tool.
- The cutting tool is feed into the work piece which rotates about its own axis causing the workpiece to form the desired shape.
- A lathe may be small and sit on a workbench or table, not requiring a stand.



Specifications of Lathe Machine



A Lathe machine can be specified as per:

- Distance between centers
- Swing over the bed
- Swing over the cross slide
- Horsepower of the motor
- Number of speeds
- Feed Given







- Woodturning: Used to make wooden objects such as ornate table legs, baseball bats, wooden bowl, and platters; operators use a variety of tools to form
- Metalworking: Used to create precision parts; most often associated with a multistep process requiring different tools for each step
- Metal Spinning: A process where metal spins on a spindle, while the operator works it with tools; an automated process





- Acrylic Spinning: Involves spinning acrylic on a spindle to form items from acrylic; most often used in the making of the top pieces for trophies
- •Thermal Spraying: Combines the rotating spindle with the painting process; the paint sticks to the stock via processes involving heating the paint materials
- Pottery: By using a potter's wheel, artisans can make a variety of pottery pieces; though formed mainly by hand, crafts persons also use tools

Important parts of Lathe machine

Objective



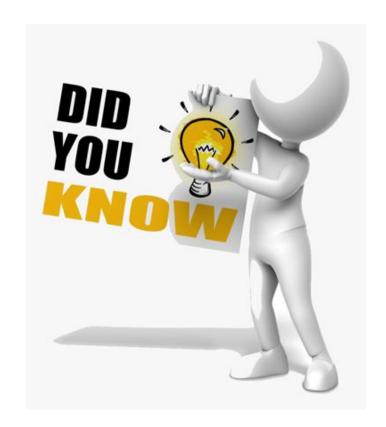

Did you Know?



- Lathe machine has different parts and the role of every part is crucial with respect to the working applications.
- Generally the base is made up of cast iron which have very good damping property.





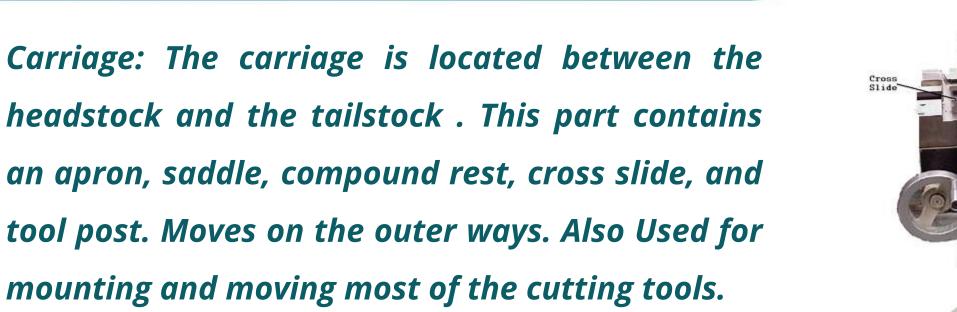
Headstock: The headstock is generally located on the left side of the lathe and consists of gears, spindles, chucks and feed controllers.

Tailstock: Usually located on the right side of the lathe. Fits on the inner ways of the bed and can slide towards the headstock to fit the length of the workpiece.

Bed: Bed is commonly made up of cast iron with heavy rigid frame on which all the main components are mounted.





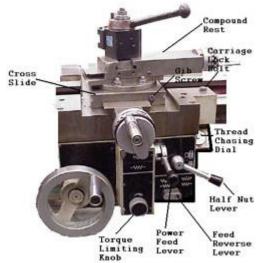


Chuck: This allows the mounting of workpieces

that are in round, square, or triangular shape.

Feed rod: Supports the carriage during transverse movement.





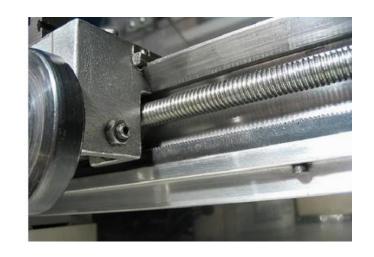




Lead screw: This helps to move the carriage in transverse direction by the mechanism called rack and pinion. It has ACME thread through out length of the rod.

Chip Pan: Usually chip pan is present at the bottom of the lathe. A chip pan is used to collect the chips that are produced during machining.

Hand Wheel: It is the wheel that is operated by the operator to move cross slide, carriage, tailstock, and other parts that have hand wheels.







Legs: These are the supports that carries entire weight of the machine.

Gearbox: Inside the headstock, Gear mechanism plays an important role to control the speed with levers.

Spindle: It is the part which rotates continuously during machining and attached with chuck.

Tool Post: Holding point of cutting tools.

Guide ways: To ensure the movement of tailstock and carriage on the bed.

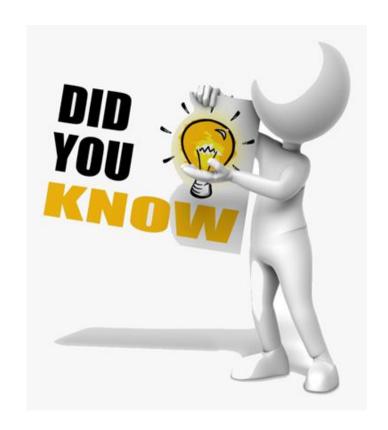

- Work holding devices are the apparatus used to keep a workpiece stable and immobile.
- The means of holding and supporting a work or tool on a lathe machine is called a lathe machine accessories; which are used for various operations.





Lernern Shaping Futures

- Work holding devices are used to locate, support, and secure workpieces for various types of manufacturing operations.
- These accessories are the integral part of machining.
- The choice of the device depends on the shape, length, diameter, and weight of the workpiece.
- The type of cuts you take also plays a important role in the selection of work holding devices.





These are the some of work holding devices used for late operations;





- •Three Jaw Chucks self-centering and hold regular shapes
- •Four Jaw Chucks not self-centering and hold eccentric type work
- •Magnetic Chucks hold the job by magnetic force.











Face plate:

- Faceplates generally have a circular shape and have a threaded hole at their center.
- They are used to hold large, heavy and irregular-shaped workpieces.

Driving Plates and Catch Plates:

• Driving plates and catch plates are generally used to drive a workpiece that is held between centers. While both types of plates have a disk shape, driving plates have a driving pin on the face that is used to engage with straight tail carriers.







Lathe Dogs:

- Also known as carriers, are used along with driving plates.
- The workpiece is inserted into the eye of the lathe dog and then firmly secured with a screw.
- They can be divided into two categories depending on the type of tail:
- 1. Straight tail (paired with driving plates)
- 2. Bent tail (paired with catch plates)





Centers:

- Centers are useful in holding the workpiece in a lathe between centers.
- The shank of a center has Morse taper on it and the face is conical shape.
- There are two types of centers.
- 1. Live center rotates with the workpiece
- 2. Dead center doesn't rotate with the workpiece







Rests:

- Rests are used to support a long workpiece.
- They are typically placed at some intermediate point to prevent the workpiece from deflection.

Arbors:

- Also called Mandrels, are used to hold previously drilled or bored holes for outer surface machining.
- The workpiece is loaded over the mandrels between the centers. Mandrels are generally tapered, and their ends are slightly smaller than the original diameter for easy gripping.

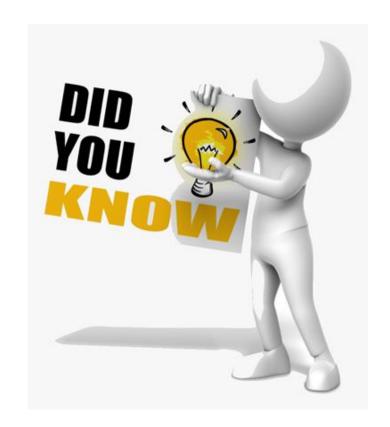

• Cutting tools are used to cut the workpiece during machining process. There are so many types of cutting tools used in lathe machine for different operations. They are available in different shapes and made from various materials.







- For general purpose, the tool used in lathe machine is a single point cutting tool.
- But for special operations multipoint tools may use.
- Cutting tools are available in different sizes for respective functions of lathe.
- The available tools such as forming tool, shaping tool, boring tool etc.
- Generally the tools are made up of strong materials.





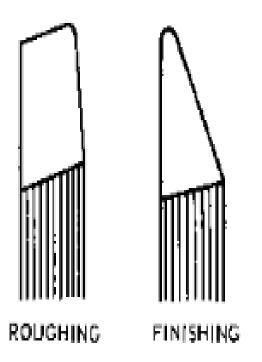
There are various types of cutting tools that are used for Lathe;

- 1. <u>Turning Tool</u>: There are mainly two types of turning tool.
- Rough Turning Tool:

The main function of a rough turning tool is to remove the maximum amount of material in minimum time that the tool.

• Finish Turning Tool:

Turning tool is used to remove the very small amount of material. A tool angle is so ground that it can produce a very



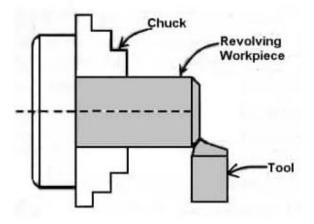

2. Chamfering Tool:

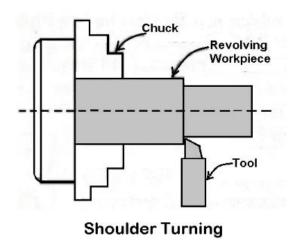
- Straight turning tools are also used as a chamfering tool by setting at an angle of the chamfer.
- Where a large number of chamfer works are to be performed a special chamfering tool is used.

3. Shoulder Turning Tool:

• A square shoulder is turned by a knife-edge turning tool. A beveled shoulder may be turned by a straight turning tool having a side cutting edge angle and zero nose radius

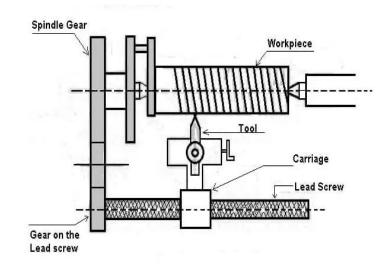


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4. Thread Cutting Tool:

- 4.1 External Thread Cutting Tool:
- Metric, B.S.W and American "V" threads are formed by a single point thread cutting tool. Its cutting edges sharpened to the shape and size of the thread to be cut.
- 4.2 Internal Thread Cutting Tool:
- The cutting edge of the tool is exactly similar to an external thread cutting tool but the front clearance angle is sufficiently increased as

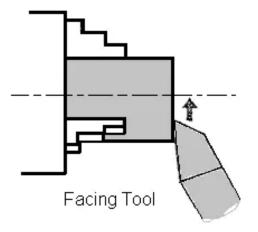


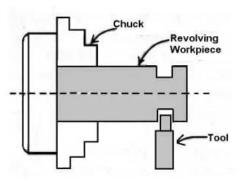
5. Facing Tool:

- A facing tool removes metal by its side cutting edges. So no top rake in necessary in facing tool.
- The figure shows H.S.S. facing tool intended for finishing operation.

6. **Grooving Tool:**

- Grooving tool is similar to a parting-off tool.
- The cutting edges are made square, rounded or "V" shape according to the shape of the groove to be cut.





Grooving

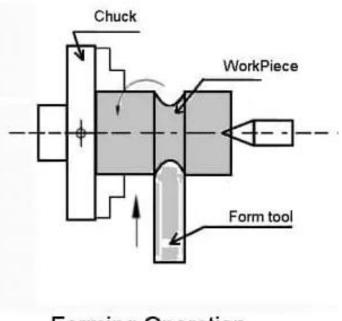


7. Forming Tool:

Turning curved profiles are affected by using:

An ordinary lathe turning tool may fulfill the purpose where a copying attachment is used to reproduce the forms.

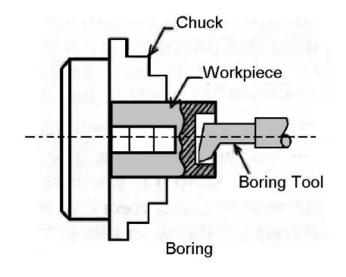


Forming Operation



8. Boring Tool:

- A boring tool is similar to a left-hand external turning tool.
- The tool may be a bit type inserted in a boring bar or holder having a tool shank.
- 9. Counterboring Tool:
- The counterboring operation can be performed by a common boring tool.
- A counterbore having multiple cutting edges is commonly preferred.





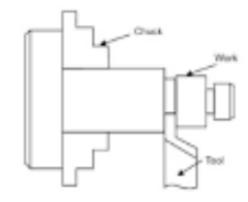


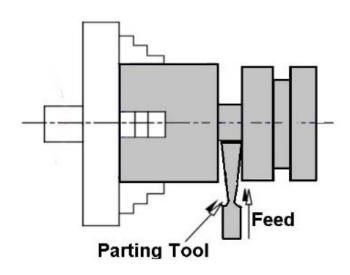
10. <u>Undercutting Tool</u>:

Undercutting or grooving tool has a point and form of the cutting edge exactly similar to the form of the groove.

11. Parting Off Tool:

A parting off tool is normally forged and used as bits for cemented carbide tipped cutting tools. Parting off tool is made as narrow as possible to remove the minimum material.





Materials of Cutting Tools



Carbon tool steel:

- These plain carbon steel cutting tool have the composition of 0.6-1.5% carbon and very small amount of Mn, Si.
- Other metal like Cr, V are added to change the hardness of cutting tool.

High-speed steel (HSS):

- This is a high carbon steel with a significant amount of alloying element, such as tungsten, molybdenum, chromium, etc.
- It gives a higher metal removal rate. It loses its hardness at a







Cemented carbide tool and cermet:

- The cemented carbide cutting tool is produced by powder metallurgy technique.
- It consists of tungsten, tantalum and titanium carbide with cobalt as a binder element.

Ceramics:

• Most common ceramic materials are aluminum oxide and silicon nitride. Powder of ceramic material Compacted in insert shape, then sintered at high temperature. Ceramic tools are chemically inert and shows resistance to corrosion.





Diamond:

• It is the hardest material and it is also expensive. It possesses very high thermal conductivity and melting point. Diamond offers best abrasion resistance, low friction coefficient and low thermal expansion.

Cubic boron nitride (CBN):

• It is the second hardest material after diamond material.

They are generally used in hand machines. They offer high resistance to abrasion and use as an abrasive for grinding wheels.

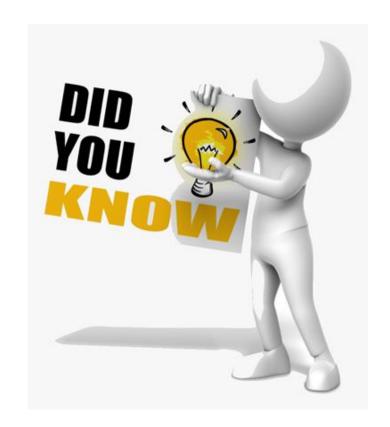

• A lathe can be of two types; bench lathe and centre lathe. Bench lathe fixed on a work bench while centre lathe fixed to ground. Both have different applications and advantages related to their work.



Introduction to Bench Lathe



- A bench lathe is a material reduction machine built into a worktable. A lathe takes a solid block of a material and reduces it to create a symmetrical item.
- Using a bench lathe, you can cut, knurl or sand material down to create a new object.
- The lathe is designed to hold the block at two points and spin it while allow the user to reduce the material to the new shape.



Introduction to Centre Lathe



- The Centre Lathe is used to manufacture cylindrical shapes of materials like steels and plastics.
- These may be lathes operated directly by people or CNC machines with working program.
- This type of lathe is controlled by a person turning the handles on the top slide and cross slide in order to make a product / part.
- The speed of rotation of the chuck is usually set by using the gear levers.



Applications of Bench Lathe



- Bench lathe Used for metal working.
- Carpentry works also done by Bench lathe machines
- These machines can also perform for pottery works.

Applications of Centre Lathe



- Used for glass turning operation
- Automobile industries use centre lathe machines
- for making crankshaft

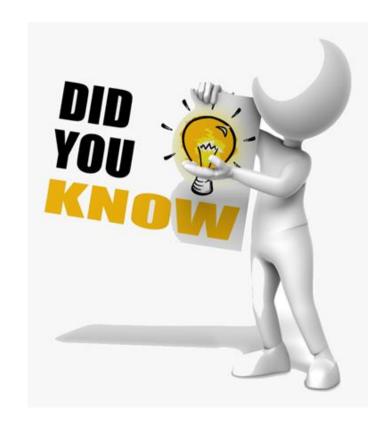

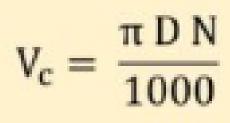

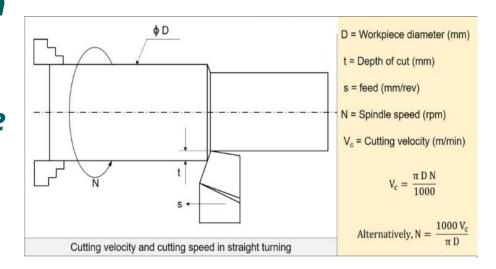






- The cutting speed (v_c) of a tool is the speed at which the metal is removed by the tool from workpiece.
- In lathe, it is the peripherial speed of the workpiece. It is expressed in meters per minute.



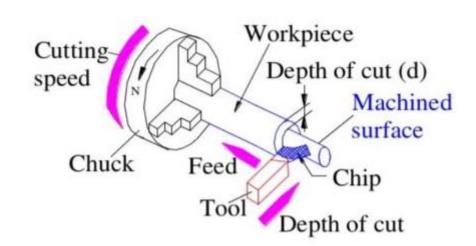


Feed



- The feeds of the cutting tool in lathe work are the distance the tool advances for each revolution of the workpiece. Feed is expressed in millimeters per revolution.
- In the British system, it is expressed in inches per revolution.
- Increased feed reduces the cutting time. But increased feed greatly reduces tool life.

Depth of cut

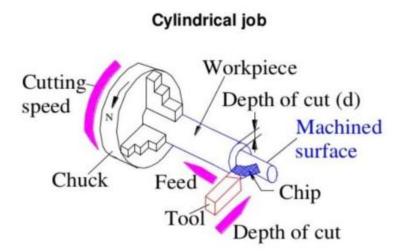


The depth of cut (d) is the perpendicular distance measured from the machined surface to the uncut surface of the work.

d1 – diameter of the workpiece surface before machining.

d2 – diameter of the machined surface.

$$Depth\ Of\ Cut = \frac{d_1 - d_2}{2}$$

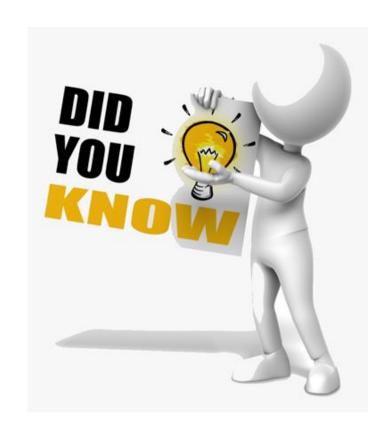

• Facing is a common machining process that involves the use of a lathe machine to remove material from the end and/or shoulder of a workpiece.



Introduction to Facing



• When facing on lathe, the machinist uses a facing tool to cut a flat surface perpendicular to the work's rotational axis. The facing tool is then fed perpendicularly across the axis.

• Facing will take the workpiece down to its finished length very accurately: depending on how much material needs to be taken out, a machinist can choose to take roughing or finishing cuts.

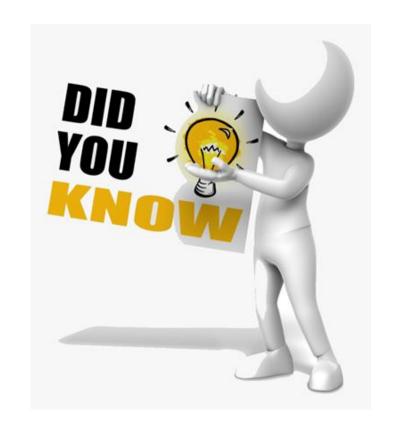

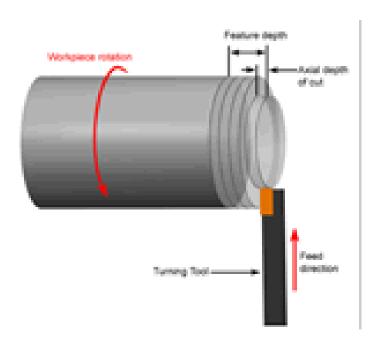
• The general process of plain turning involves rotating a part while a single-point cutting tool is moved parallel to the axis of rotation. Turning can be done on the external surface of the part as well as the internal surface.







- Plain Turning is a material removal process, which is used to create rotational parts by cutting away unwanted material.
- The turning process requires a turning machine or lathe, workpiece, fixture, and cutting tool to conduct the operation.
- The cutter is typically a single-point cutting tool that is fixed in the machine tool post.
- The cutting tool feeds into the rotating workpiece and cuts away material to get the



Needs and Applications of Plain Turning

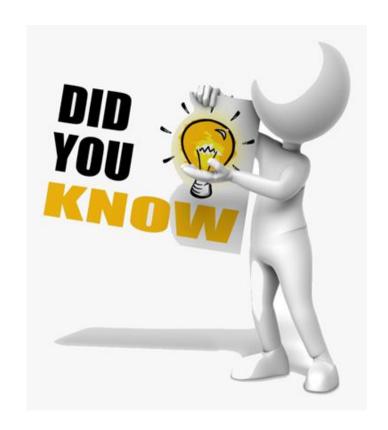

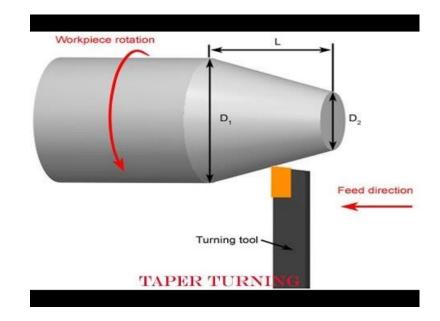
- Taper turning is a machining operation, which means that the diameter of cylindrical workpieces gradually decreases from one part to another.
- The taper can be external or internal.







- Taper turning is a turning process in which the cutting tool moves at an angle to the axis of the workpiece so that the workpiece receives a tapered shape.
- In a tapered piece, the diameter of the workpiece varies uniformly from one end to the other end.
- The workpiece must be positioned in such a way as to make the taper such that the axis of rotation is at the angle to an axis of the tool.

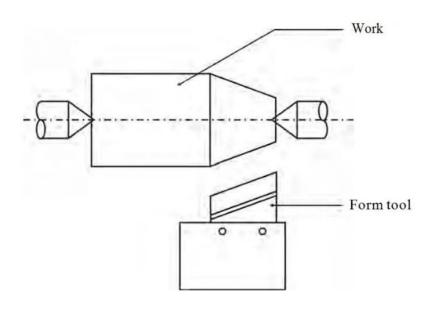






1.Form tool method:

- Form tool method is one of the simplest methods to produce a short type taper.
- In this method, a form tool having straight cutting edge is set onto the work at a half taper angle and is fed straight into the workpiece. The tool used in this method is known as taper turning form tool.
- The tool used itself is of taper shape hence producing tapered workpiece as output.

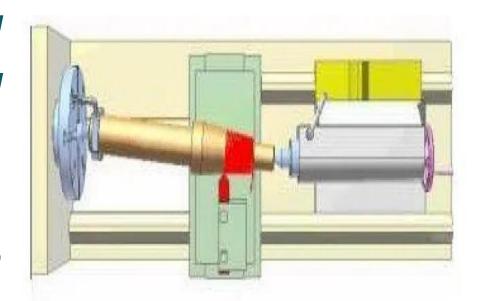






2. Tailstock set over method:

- Generally, when the angle of taper is very small this taper turning methods in lathe machine will be conducted.
- The workpiece be placed in the live center. Now, the tailstock will be moved in a cross-wise, which is perpendicular to the lathe axis by turning the set over method.
- This process is known as tailstock set over method.







2. Tailstock set over method(calculation):

The amount of offset is calculated in the following way,

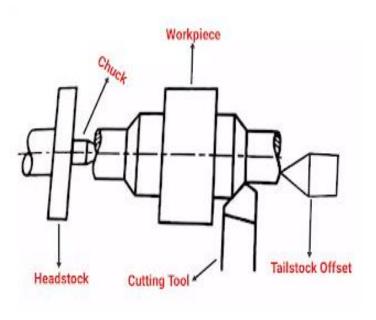
 $Offset=(Taper \times L)/2000$

Where,

Offset is in mm.

Taper = millimeter/meter

L = Length of workpiece in mm

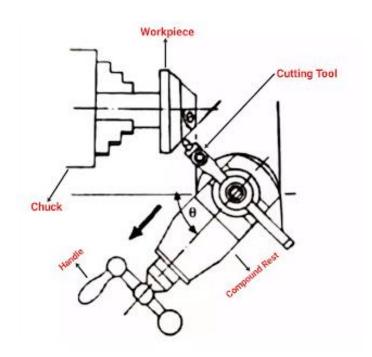






3.Compound Rest Method:

- This method is typically used to produce short and steep cones.
- In this method, the compound rest is swiveled at the required angle and held in position.
- The compound rest can be rotated up to 45 degrees. The workpiece is held in the chuck & will be rotated in the lathe axis as same as turning.







3.Compound Rest Method(calculation):

Tan $\theta = D-d/2L$

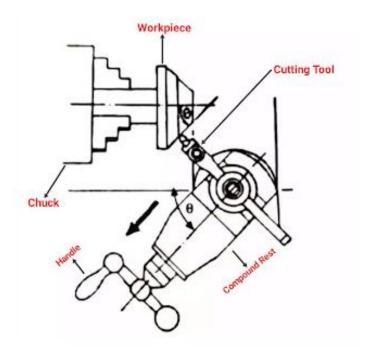
 $\theta = tan-1 (D-d/2L)$

Where,

D = Larger diameter of the taper

d = Smaller diameter of the taper

L = Length of the taper







4. Taper turning attachment method:

- A Taper Turning Attachment may be used for longer tapers if the workpieces are larger in length.
- In this taper turning method a different attachment of lathe machine, a taper turning attachment is attached to the rear end of the machine bed.
- It has a guide bar which is usually pivoted at the center. The guide bar has the ability to swing and it can be set in any angle.





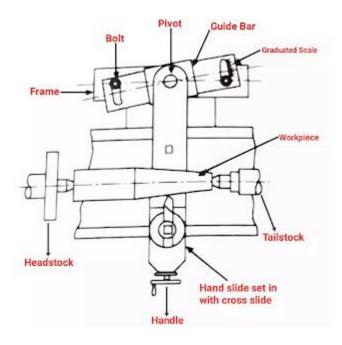


4. Taper turning attachment method(calculation):

The angle is calculated using the formula,

$$tan (\alpha/2) = (D-d)/2I \text{ or } tan \theta = (D-d)/2I$$

- θ = Total angle, θ = $\alpha/2$
- D = Large diameter of workpiece
- d = Small diameter of workpiece
- l = Length of workpiece

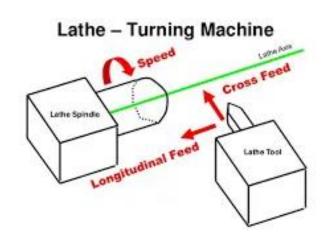






5.Combining Feeds Method:

- In this method, longitudinal and cross feeds are performed simultaneously, so that the tool moves along the diagonal path.
- The trajectory of the resultant can be adjusted by changing the feed rate by changing the gears given within the apron.

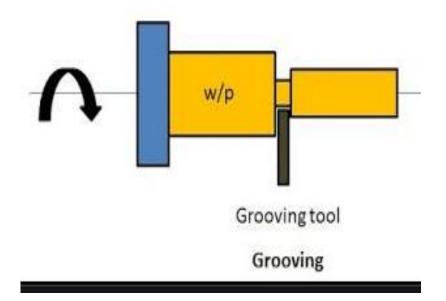
- The term grooving usually applies to a process of forming narrow cavity of a certain depth on a cylinder, cone, or a face of the part.
- Parting uses a blade-like cutting tool plunged directly into the workpiece to cut off the workpiece at a specific length.



Introduction to Grooving



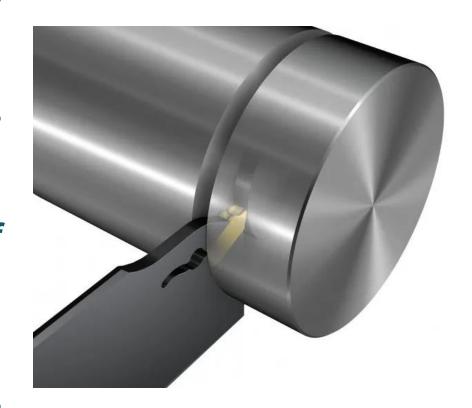
- Cutting tools for grooving are either external or internal type and uses a variety of inserts in different configurations.
- The difference between grooving and turning is the direction of cut.
- Grooving tool is normally used to cut in a single direction only.
- There is another application of a two axis simultaneous motion in grooving, a corner breaking on the grooves.



Introduction to Parting



- Parting is the process whereby a part that has been made, or is wanted for another operation, on the end of a bar is cut off from the rest of the bar
- It is normally used to remove the finished end of a workpiece from the bar stock that is clamped in the chuck.
- Other uses include things such as cutting the head off a bolt.







- Grooving usually used to cut external or internal grooves, and many other machining operations.
- Grooving are often done on workpiece shoulders to ensure the correct fit for mating parts.





- Parting process is used for producing machine components by slicing that from long workpiece.
- It is used to produce small objects like nuts, bolts from a long piece.

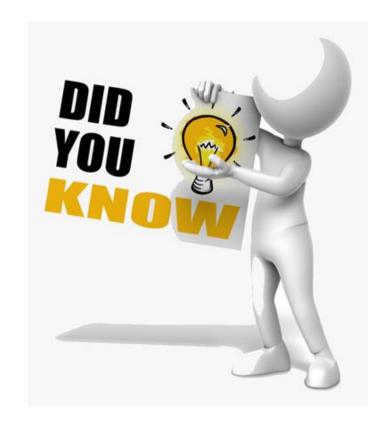

• Knurling is a process of impressing a diamond shaped or straight line pattern into the surface of a workpiece by using specially shaped hardened metal wheels to improve its appearance and to provide a better gripping surface.



Introduction to Knurling



- The knurling tool must be set in the tool post with the axis of the knurling head at centre height and the face of the knurls parallel with the workpiece surface.
- A slow speed is needed with a medium feed. Commonly, the speed is set to 60 to 80 RPM, while the feed is best from 0.04 mm to 0.08 mm revolution of the spindle.
- Check that the rollers move freely and are in good cutting condition; then oil the knurling tool cutting



Knurling Tools

- Two common types of knurling tools are the Knuckle joint and Revolving head type of knurling tools.
- The knuckle joint type is equipped with a single pair of rollers that revolve with the workpiece as it is being knurled.
- The revolving head type of tool is fitted with three pairs of rollers so that the pitch can be changed to a different knurl without changing the setup.

Knuckle joint knurling tool

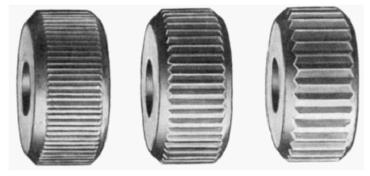
Knurling Patterns



- There are two knurl patterns, diamond and straight type.
- There are three pitches of rollers that are coarse, medium, and fine.
- The diamond is the most common pattern and the medium pitch is used most.
- The coarse pitch is used for large diameter work while the fine pitch is used for small diameter work.

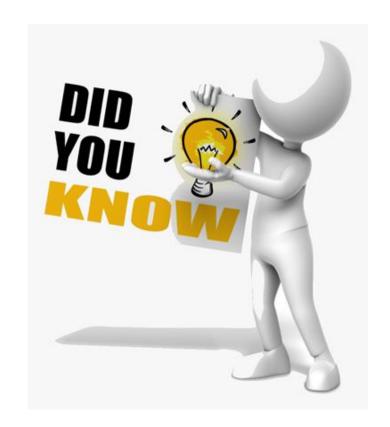

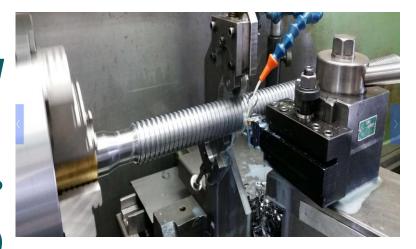
• Thread cutting on the lathe is a process that produces a helical ridge of uniform section on the workpiece. This is performed by taking successive cuts with a threading tool and the same shape as the thread form required.



Introduction to Threading

- For producing threads of pitch 'p' mm, the tool must travel a distance equal to 'p'(mm) as the workpiece makes one complete rotation.

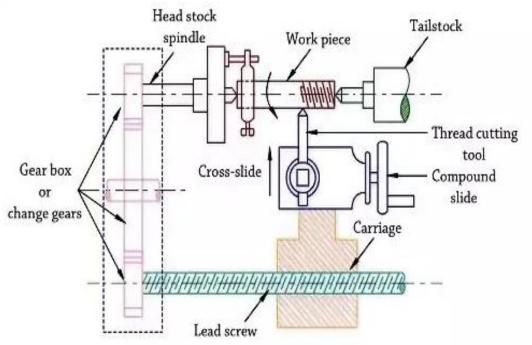


Threading



• The following relationship is used to determine the gears/wheels required to generate threads of definite pitch.

Gearing Ratio = <u>Pitch of screw to be cut</u> Pitch of lead screw
