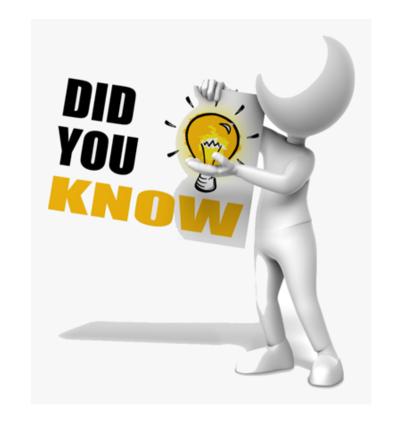

Did you Know?



- A Milling machine uses a milling cutter to remove material from the surface of a work piece.
- This process is known as milling operation. Generally cutters have multi edges.







- **Definition**: Milling machine does the process of machining using rotary cutters to remove material by advancing the cutter into a workpiece.
- This may be done by varying direction on one or several axes, cutter head speed, and pressure.
- Milling covers a wide variety of different operations.
- It is used to machined the flat, rough and irregular surfaces and this is done by feeding the workpiece against a rotating milling cutter.





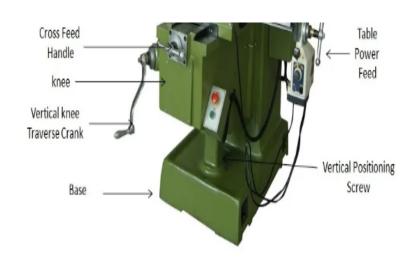


1. Column & Base:

• Column including base is the main casting that supports all other parts of milling machine.

2. Knee:

- It is a casting that supports the saddle and table.
- All gearing mechanism is enclosed within the knee part. It is fastened to the column by dovetail guide ways.
- The knee is supported and adjusted by a vertical positioning screw known as elevating screw.





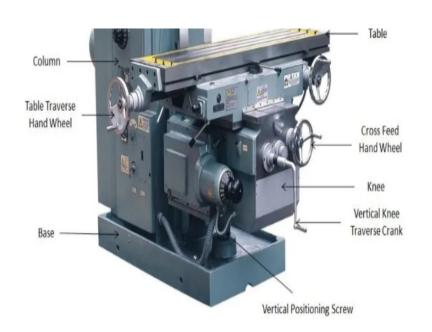


3. Saddle and Swivel Table:

- The saddle is present on the knee and supports the table.
- It slides on a horizontal dovetail ways on the knee.

4. Power Feed Mechanism:

• The knee which contains the power feed mechanism. It is used to control the longitudinal (left and right), transverse (in and out) and vertical (up and down) feeds.

5. Table

- It is a rectangular casting which is present on the top of saddle.
- It is used to hold the work or work holding devices.

6. Spindle

- It is the shaft that is used to hold and drives the cutting tools of the milling machine.
- The spindle is mounted on the bearings and supported by the column.
- Spindle is driven by the electric motor through gear trains.



Parts of Milling Machine



7. Over Arm / Overhanging Arm:

- It is a horizontal beam present at the top of the column.
- It may be a single casting which slides on the dovetail ways present on the top face of the column. The overhanging arm in the vertical machine is called ram.

8. Arbor Support:

- It is a casting with bearing that supports the outer end of the arbor.
- It also helps in aligning the outer end of the arbor with the spindle.

Types of Milling Machine

1. Horizontal Milling Machine

In horizontal milling machine the axis of rotation of the spindle is horizontal to the table. And due the axis of spindle horizontal, it is called as horizontal milling machine.



The milling machine in which the spindle axis is perpendicular to the table is called vertical milling machine.





Types of Milling Machine

3. Knee-Type Milling Machine

The milling machine which has a knee like projection at the middle is called knee-type milling machine. It is characterized by a vertical adjustable work table resting on a saddle supported by a knee.

4. Ram-Type Milling Machine

A milling machine which has a ram on the top of the column is called ram type milling machine. Generally ram is used in vertical milling machine. It can be moved on the column in transverse direction.











5. Universal Milling Machine

- The universal milling machine is suitable for milling planes, bevels, grooves, etc. using a variety of bar milling cutters, circular milling cutters, and angle milling cutters.
- If you use the universal milling head, round table, indexing head and other milling machine accessories, you can expand the processing range of the machine.
- The machine has sufficient rigidity and power, and has powerful machining capabilities for high-speed and heavyduty cutting operations and gear machining.







A Milling machine can be specified as per:

- Working Surface
- Number of T-slots
- width of T-slots
- Pitch of T-slots
- Maximum distance from spindle centre to underside of over support







- Milling machines are usually used to machine flat surfaces, but can also produce irregular surfaces.
- They can also be used to drill, bore, cut gears, and produce slots.

Cutting Tools used for Milling





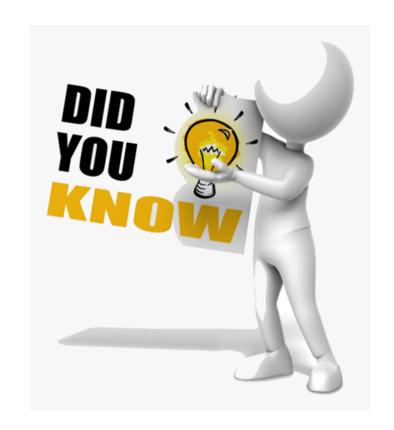

Did you Know?



• The cutting tools used for milling is known as Milling cutters. For different operations we select different cutting tools. Usually cutters used in milling are multi point cutting tools.



Following are the types of milling cutters that we use in different milling machines:

End Milling cutter:

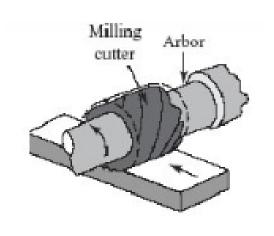
End mill cutters are the type of cutters used in the milling which has teeth at the end or at the face of the circular disk.

Periphery Milling Cutter:

When the cutting teeth are present on the periphery of the circular disk then it is known as periphery milling cutter.









Side Milling Cutter:

Side Mill cutter is a type of cutter in which the cutting teeth are present on the periphery and also at the face or end.

Face Milling Cutter:

Face mill Cutter consists of a large diameter cutter body with a number of mechanically fastened inserted tipped tools.

The diameter of the cutter body depends upon the length of the workpiece.







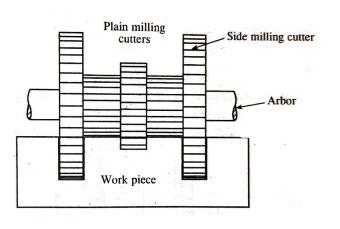
Staggered Mill Cutter:

Staggered Mill cutter has their teeth staggered at the periphery with alternate right-hand and lefthand helix angles and are made in relatively narrow width.

Gang Milling cutter:

It is a type of cutter in which the peripheral milling cutters of the different sizes are cut together to remove the material simultaneously from the workpiece.









Concave Milling Cutter:

The concave cutter is a type of formed type cutter. Concave Milling Cutter is a type of cutter which is shaped to mill a convex surface of circular contour equal to half of a circle or less.

Cylindrical Milling Cutter:

Cylindrical Mill Cutter is the type of cutter which has a cylindrical shape and has teeth on the circumferential surface only.







Woodruff cutter:

This tool used to cut the keyway for a woodruff key. It is slightly hollow ground on the sides for relief and the teeth are not side cutting. The teeth come in both straight and staggered varieties.

Hollow milling cutter:

It looks like a pipe having thicker walls. The cutting teeth of the hollow mills on the inside surfaces. This cutter used in the screw machines.









Thread mill cutter:

The thread is produced by doing a helical interpolation.



Ball cutter:

It is also called as ball nosed cutters. Ball cutters as their end are hemispherical in shape; It is used to decrease stress concentration.







Hobbing cutter:

It is also is a cutting tool used to cut the teeth into the work piece. This is cylindrical in shape with helical cutting teeth.



Dovetail cutter:

The dovetail cutter is an end mill whose form leaves behind a dovetail slot.

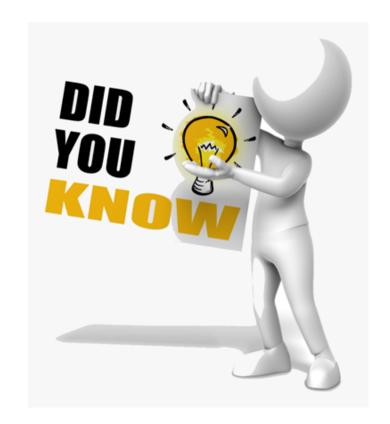

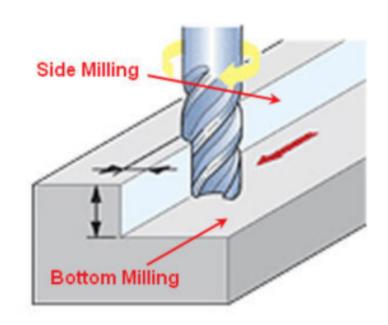
• The side milling is the production of a flat vertical surface on the side of a work piece by using a sidemilling cutter. The depth of cut is adjusted by rotating the vertical feed screw of the table.







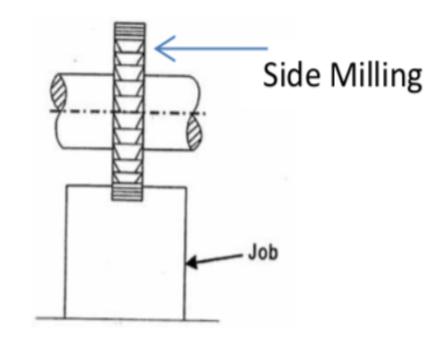
- Side milling operation generally performed on horizontal milling machine.
- The cutting tool used for this operation is called as side milling cutter.
- The side milling cutter is connected to the arbor part of the machine.
- There are four types of side mill cutter available; They are: Plain side milling cutter, Half side milling cutter, Staggered teeth side milling cutter, Interlocking side milling cutter.







- Side milling is used for forming T-slots on workpieces.
- Also used for making key-ways on workpieces.

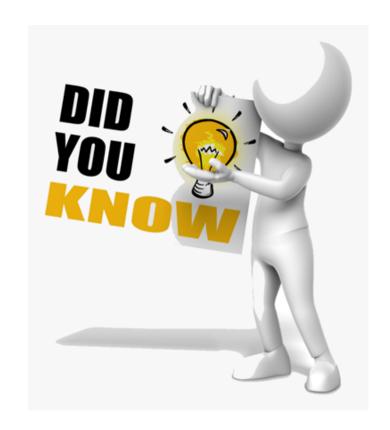

• Profile milling is a type of milling process, usually used to semi-finish or finish the vertical or slanted surfaces, including multi-axis milling of convex and concave shapes in two or three dimensions.



Introduction to Profile Milling



- Profile milling covers multi-axis milling of convex and concave shapes in two and three dimensions.
- A larger component which have more complicated configuration can be done by profile milling process.
- The machining process should be divided into at least three operation types:
- 1. Roughing/semi-roughing
- 2. Semi-finishing
- 3. Finishing







- Profile Milling is generally used for forming cavity on workpieces.
- Also used for making complex shapes on workpieces.

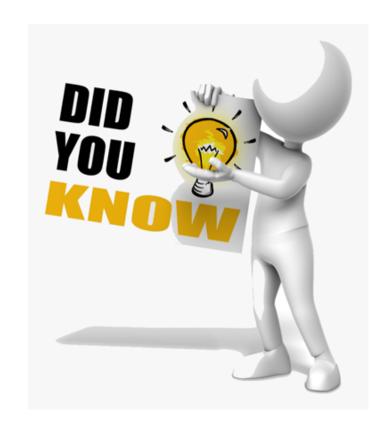

- Face milling is the most common milling operation and can be performed using a wide range of different tools.
- Cutters with a 45° entering angle are most frequently used but round insert cutters, square shoulder cutters and face mills are also used for certain conditions.







- Face milling is a machining process in which the milling cutter is placed perpendicular to the workpiece.
- The milling cutting is essentially positioned "face down" towards the top of the workpiece.
- When engaged, the top of the milling cutting grinds away at the top of the workpiece to remove some of the material.
- Milling cutters are made from High Speed Steel
 (HSS) and some are carbide tipped.







- Face milling is generally used for producing wide flat surfaces.
- Also used for removing more materials from rectangular workpieces.
