Agreement

- When an Offer is made by one person ,known as Offeror,and accepted by another person ,known as offeree,it becomes a Promise.
- Section 2(e) of the Indian Contract Act states that every Promise and every set of Promises forming Consideration for each other is an Agreement.
- It implies that an Agreement is an accepted proposal
