Introduction

- An appropriate mix of fiscal and monetary measures can be helpful in controlling inflation
- Fiscal policy is the use of government spending and taxation to influence the economy.
- Monetary policy refers to the actions undertaken by a nation's central bank to control money supply and achieve sustainable economic growth

- > Price and Wage control





Figure-5: Different Measures for Controlling Inflation



Monetary Measures

- Traditional monetary measures
- ➤ Bank rate policy
- > Cash reserve ratio
- ➤ Open Market operation
- Non-traditional measures
- > Statutory Liquidity Ratio (SLR)
- > Selective credit controls
- > Moral Suasion
- > Credit authorization scheme





Fiscal Measures

- When excess demand is caused by the govt. expenditure, the most effective measure is to cut down the public expenditure
- When excess demand is caused by increase in private expenditure, taxation of incomes is appropriate measure

Price and wage control

- Direct measures
- Price control is generally adopted during the war period when inflation tends to gallop
- Wage control is used to combat inflation when wages tend to rise faster than productivity
