Hygrometer or Dry and Wet Bulb Thermometer

- The **wet-bulb temperature** is the temperature a parcel of air would have if it were cooled at constant pressure (adiabatically) to saturation (100% relative humidity) by the evaporation of water into it, with the latent heat being supplied by the parcel.
- An <u>actual wet-bulb thermometer</u> indicates a temperature close to the true (thermodynamic) wet-bulb temperature.
- The wet-bulb temperature is the lowest temperature that can be reached under current ambient conditions by the evaporation of water only;
- it is the temperature felt when the skin is wet and exposed to moving air.
- Wet-bulb temperature is largely determined by both actual air temperature (dry-bulb temperature) and humidity, the amount of moisture in the air.

- The thermodynamic wet-bulb temperature is the minimum temperature which may be achieved by purely evaporative cooling of a water-wetted (or even ice-covered), ventilated surface.
- For a given parcel air at a known pressure and dry-bulb temperature, the thermodynamic wet-bulb temperature corresponds to unique values of relative humidity, dew point temperature, and other properties. The relationships between these values are illustrated in a psychrometric chart.
- For "dry" air, air that is less than saturated (i.e., air with less than 100 percent relative humidity), the wet-bulb temperature is lower than the dry-bulb temperature due to evaporative cooling.
- The greater the difference between the wet and dry bulb temperatures, the drier the air and lower the relative humidity.
- The dew point temperature is the temperature at which the ambient air must cool to reach 100% relative humidity where condensate and rain form; and conversely, the wet-bulb temperature rises to converge on the dry bulb temperature.



Procedure and Observation

A simple way to get a value for the relative humidity is to use a wet-and-dry bulb hygrometer (psychrometer).

•First you need a thermometer (two would be better) shaped such that you can wrap a small piece of tissue or cloth around the bulb.

•First measure the air temperature.

•Next wrap a small piece of tissue around the bulb and wet it.

•Wait about ten minutes until the temperature stabilizes - it will be lower due to evaporation.

•Subtract the wet temperature from the dry temperature and look up the humidity in the hygrometric chart.

A more permanent setup would use two thermometers and a small water reservoir. The thermometers would be fixed on a card. One thermometer would have a piece of cloth wrapped on the bulb with the end dipping into a small reservoir of water.

Relative Humidity from Wet and Dry Bulb Thermometer (Centigrade Scale)

This table gives the approximate relative humidity directly from the reading of the air temperature (dry bulb) (t °C) and the wet bulb (T °C). It is computed for a pressure of 74.27 cm Hg. Errors resulting from the use of this table for air temperatures above 10°C and beween 77.5 and 71 cm Hg will usually be within the errors of observation.
