Sodium Thiosulfate

Sodium thiosulfate is an imperative inorganic salt with a few medicinal employments. It is likewise called sodium hyposulfite or 'hypo'.

Molecular formula-Na2S2O3 amolar mass is 158.11 g/mol. **Preparation-**Sodium thiosulfate can be set up by warming sulfur with either fluid sodium sulfite arrangement or watery sodium hydroxide arrangement.

 $6 \text{ NaOH} + 4 \text{ S} \rightarrow \text{Na2S2O3} + 2 \text{ Na2S} + 3 \text{ H2O}$

Physical properties : Sodium thiosulfate is a white crystalline strong which is unscented and exceptionally water dissolvable. It has a thickness of 1.667 g/mL and a dissolving purpose of 48.3°C.

Chemical properties: Sodium thiosulfate is a nonpartisan salt which promptly separates in water to give sodium and thiosulfate particles. Na2S2O3 is a steady strong under ordinary conditions, however decays after warming to give sodium sulfate and sodium polysulfide:

 $4 \text{ Na2S2O3} \rightarrow 3 \text{ Na2SO4} + \text{Na2S5}$

It likewise breaks down when treated with acids to give sulfur and sulfur dioxide Na2S2O3 + 2 HCl \rightarrow 2 NaCl + S + SO2 + H2O

uses

- It is an imperative cure utilized for treating cyanide harming.
- Finds use in water treatment, killing dye, calfskin tanning, gold extraction, photographic preparing, and compound warming cushions.
- It responds stoichiometrically (in equimolar sums) with fluid arrangements of iodine, thus it is broadly utilized as a part of research centers for iodine based titrations.
