


Fig 9.24 © 2001 Garland Science

# Viral Infection of Cells Can Be Blocked by Neutralizing Antibodies




Fig 9.25 © 2001 Garland Science

# Antibodies Can Prevent Attachment of Bacteria to Cell Surfaces





Fig 9.26 © 2001 Garland Science
