1. A company manufactures a type of product in three different production plants: P1, P2 and P3. Each of these production plants can produce up to 1500 units per month. The company supplies four customers who require each 1000, 1200, 1500 and 1000 units per month. The company makes a benefit of 110 units for the manufacture of each unit of product. The unit transportation costs from each production plant to each customer are displayed below:

4. A mining company extracts gravel, the basic product it sells, from three mines, L1, L2

and L3. The weekly production of each mine is 75, 150 and 75 tons of gravel respectively. The gravel has to be transported to five main consumers, K1, K2, K3, K4 and K5 requiring for their needs 100, 60, 40, 75 and 25 tons of gravel per week respectively.

The problem that concerns the company's management is the minimization of the required cost for the transportation of the product to the consumers. For this purpose a cost analysis was carried out which gave the results of the following table (the numbers denote the transportation cost in € per ton of gravel).

5. Wheat is harvested in the Midwest and stored in grain elevators in three different cities—Kansas City, Omaha, and Des Moines. These grain elevators sup- ply three flour mills, located in Chicago, St. Louis, and Cincinnati. Grain is shipped to the mills in railroad cars, each car capable of holding one ton of wheat. Each grain elevator is able to supply the following number of tons (i.e., railroad cars) of wheat to the mills on a monthly basis.
