Discuss the limitations of proportional control and how they can be overcome by incorporating integral and derivative control actions in the PID controller.

Consider a second-order system with a transfer function. Derive the expressions for the natural frequency and damping ratio of the system based on the transfer function.

Explain the concept of root locus analysis in control system design. Discuss how it can be used to determine the stability and performance of a control system.

Describe the concept of state-space representation in control systems. Discuss the advantages and limitations of using state-space models compared to transfer function models.

Discuss the concept of controllability and observability in state-space models. Explain how these properties influence the control system's design and performance.

Discuss the concept of stability augmentation in aircraft control systems. Explain the role of stability augmentation systems (SAS) in improving aircraft stability and control.
