5. Step 5: Monitor and Review the risk.

Risk management is the identification, **assessment**, and prioritization of **risks** or uncertainties followed up by minimizing, monitoring and controlling the impact of **risk** realities or enhancing the opportunity potential by applying coordinated and economical resources. **Risk management** is essential in any business.

Well-run companies will have a comprehensive **risk management framework** in place to identify existing and potential **risks** and assess how to deal with them if they arise. **Risk** identification, measurement, mitigation, reporting and monitoring, and governance are the six key pieces of an effective **framework**.
