What is staking?

Inserting a stake beside a plant in order to provide it with support while it grows.

Provide strength and support

Provide support to plants to grow upward

Prevents rotting of fruits

Support

Staking for anchorage

Keep root ball
from moving

Full or over
grown trees with
small root balls

Wet or loose soils

Windy sites

Staking for support

Keep tree straight in high wind velocity

Tall trees without bottom branches

Species with flexible trunks

Weak trunks without taper

Staking for protection

protects the tree from vehicles, humans, animals, equipment and vandals.

Sturdy metal frame around the outside of the trunk.
