# **Seed Production in Okra & Onion**

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# **Bhindi**

### Floral biology

- Often cross pollinated crop
- > Cross pollination to an extent of 12 % due to protogynous
- Anthesis is between 9 and 10 am
- > Stigma remains receptive on the day of anthesis

# Method of seed production

- Seed to seed
- ❖ Breeder seed → Foundation seed → Certified seed

### Season

June-July, September- October and February- March

## Land requirement

- > Select field on which bhendi crop was not grown in the previous season, unless the crop was of the same variety and certified.
- Field should be free from wild bhendi (*Abelmoschus* sp.)

## **Isolation requirement**

Foundation seed - 400 M Certified seed - 200 M

### **Seed rate**

Varieties : 8-10 kg/ha

Hybrids : Female - 4 kg/ha

Male - 1 kg/ha

## Manuring

- FYM 12.5 t / ha
- NPK 150:75:75 kg /ha
- 50% of N applied as top dressing in two split doses at flowering & 10 days later.

## Hybrid seed production

- Since the flowers are large in size, hand emasculation & pollination
- Emasculation & dusting as per the methods in tomato
- Planting ratio 9:1

## Roguing

- Minimum of 3 inspections for varieties and 4 inspections for hybrids
  1. Vegetative, 2 & 3. Flowering, 4. Fruit maturity stages
- ➤ Plant characters, hairiness, fruit character colour, number of ridges, fruit length etc.
- Mosaic attacked plants
- Wild bhendi if present should be removed before flowering

## Harvesting and threshing

- Fruits should be harvested when they dried (30-35 days after crossing)
- > PM Pods which expose hairline crack and turned in to brown colour picked by hand
- > Seeds separated manually by split open / beaten with pliable stick
- > Then the seed are cleaned, dried and treated with captan/thriam.

# Onion: Seed To Seed Method

- A considerable amount of onion seed is produced by seed to seed method
- Which avoids the use of mother bulbs
- ➤ It is economical in the sense that production of seed takes only one year
- Large quantities of bulbs are not be stored, losses in stores are avoided and less cost of production by eliminating expenses on harvesting and replanting bulbs.
- ➤ Offers higher seed yield because of the greater number of plants and seed head per unit area
- Seed from seed to seed crop should not be used again for seed production because it is almost impossible to do completely satisfactory rouging

# Bulb to seed method

- Mother bulbs are grown & are stored carefully till middle of October
- Temp. for storage 4.5 14°C because plants of such bulbs produce heavy yield than those bulbs which have been stored at higher or lower temp.
- ➤ Bulbs selected for replanting should have roots intact and free from disease, thin necked, single and true to type
- ➤ Bulbs should be treated with 2% systemic copper fungicide before planting.
- Too close planting may subject to the attack of downy mildew because ventilation around the plant is impeded
- Moreover planting distance depends upon the size of bulb

### Season

Middle of June - Middle of July

### Land requirement

Select fields in which an onion crop was not grown in the previous year, unless it was the same variety and was certified by the certification agency

### **Isolation requirement**

Foundation seed - 1000 M Certified seed - 500 M

#### **Seed rate**

5-6 kg / ha

### Nursery

Treated seeds sown in raised nursery beds with the spacing of 5 cm at 2 cm depth.

Apply carbofuron @ 100g / cent before sowing

10-12 cent nursery area sufficient for one ha

### **Transplanting**

Age - 30-35 days old seedlings transplanted during August Spacing - 20 x 10 cm on both the sides of ridges.

### **Bulb lifting (Harvest) and Storage**

- November December
- Developed bulbs after 100-110 days (after transplanting) are carefully lifted with tops and allowed for aeration under shade with good aeration.
- Tops are removed after 2 days.
- Then the bulbs are stored for curing by spreading the bulbs in single layer under cool, dry and aerated places.

### Planting bud for seed production

- December January
- Stored seed bulbs are graded and the bulbs with 40-50 g are selected for planting.
- > Small and very large size bulbs are rejected.
- Before planting, the 1/3 portion of the top of the bulbs are sharply cut and treated with Bavistin 0.2% solution for about 5 min.
- Cutting of bulbs will facilitate good and early germination and bolting.
- Bulbs planted with the spacing of 30 x 20 cm both the sides of ridges.

#### Flowering and seed maturity

- ➤ February March
- ➤ Bolting (flowering) will start 40-45 days after bulb planting
- > Seed matures after 120 days after planting.
- Normally 4-7 flower stalks will appear from one bulb.

#### **Harvestin and Processing**

- Maturity of seed indicated (April-May) by turning into black colour
- Matured seed bunches are harvested before shattering & dried under shade
- Normally 2-3 harvests are required depends up on the maturity of the seed
- ➤ Harvest the seeds by cutting the seed head with 10-15 cm of stem attached
- ➤ Harvested umbels are heaped for a few days for drying before threshing. This helps in proper curing of seed
- > Then the seeds are separated from the capsules by hand threshing or using pliable sticks
- Seeds are cleared, graded by using 10 x 10 BSS sieve, dried to 6-8 % MC and treated with captan or thiram @ 2-3 g/kg of seed.
