The antipsychotic acyivity of phenothiazine is affected by following substituents

Alkyl side chain

- for maximum activity the phenothiazine ring and nitrogen atom must be connected by three carbon chain
- OBranching of carbon chain at β position by small alkyl groups decreases activity.
- O bridging of position 3 of the side chain to 1 of phenothiazine significantly reduces antipsychotic activity.

Amino group

For maximum activity the amino function must be tertiary in nature.

Primary and secondary amino groups are less potent

- O Alkylation of the amino group with groups larger than methyl decreaes antipsychotic activity.
- O Compound containing piperizine / piperidine ring are less potent than dimethylamino derivatives but substitution at 4th position of piperazine / piperidine by hydroxyethyl group substentially increases the activity.

Phenothiazine ring substituents

- OThe location and nature of substituent on the substituent critically affect the antipsychotic activity.
- \circ Potency increases in the following order of position of ring substituents 1 < 4 < 3 < 2
- o 2^{nd} substituents of phenothiazine increases the potency in following order OH < H < CH₃ < C₃H₇CO < CH₃CO < SCH₃ < CF₃
- O Oxidation of sulphur atom of phenothizine decrease activity.
