

Problem to Response Public health problems are diverse and can include:

- emergencies
- injuries
- environmental health problems · other health threats

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- Surveillance- What is the problem or Is there a problem?
- Risk Factor Identification- What is the cause?
- Intervention Evaluation- What works?
- Implementation-How do you do it?

Key Terms in Public Health

- clinical care: prevention, treatment, and management of illness and the preservation of mental and physical well-being through the services offered by medical and allied health professions; also known as health care.
- determinant: factor that contributes to the generation of a trait.
- epidemic or outbreak: occurrence in a community or region of cases of an illness, specific healthrelated behavior, or other health-related event clearly in excess of normal expectancy. Both terms are used interchangeably; however, epidemic usually refers to a larger geographic distribution of illness or health-related events.
- health outcome: result of a medical condition that directly affects the length or quality of a person's life.
