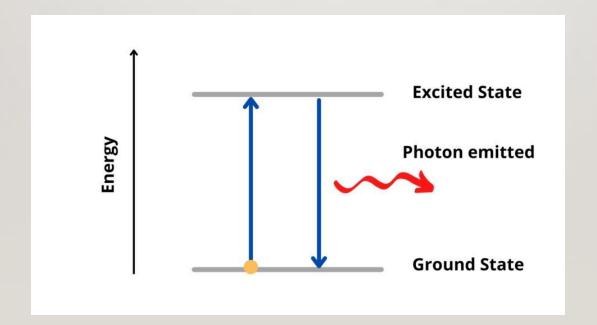
PYROTECHNICS: LIGHT GENERATING

Pyrotechnics:

- Pyrotechnics are the art of making or the manufacture and use of fireworks.
- The person who is responsible for safe storage, handling, functioning of pyrotechnics and pyrotechnic devices is called pyrotechnician.



• The light is produced by the electrons inside the metal atom in visible region.



- Pyrotechnic composition contains nitrates and perchlorates as oxidisers and alkaline earth metal i.e magnesium, aluminium, zirconium and titanium as fuels.
- The temperature must be greater than 3000k in order to generate light in visible region.



- Pyrotechnic colorant is a chemical compound which causes a flame to burn with a particular color.
- The color of the flame is dependent on the metal cations such as barium, copper, etc.
- The anions influence the flame temperature.

- Red strontium chloride [Srcl2], strontium sulphate [SrSo4], strontium carbonate [SrCo3], etc.
- To achieve higher temperature aluminium and magnesium can be used which emit white light. Titanium and zirconium are good elements for emission of white light.





• Blue – copper compounds



• Green – barium compounds

• Purple – combination of red and blue
